**A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE DESIGNATION OF  
G. MELTON MOBLEY FOR PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING A  
HEARING AS TO THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF CITY OF  
SANDY SPRINGS CODE OF ORDINANCE RELATING TO  
OCCUPATION TAX CERTIFICATE AND HOME OCCUPATION**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Sandy Springs (“City”) is a political subdivision of the State of Georgia (“State”) and is duly organized and existing pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Sandy Springs (“City Council”) are charged with the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 1.04 of the City Charter grants the City the power to collect regulatory fees and taxes on occupations, trades and professions and to permit and regulate the same; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 7.8.8.A.8(a) of the City Development Code prohibits the display, stock-in-trade and any commodity sold or stored on the premises in connection with a home occupation; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 54-124 (c) of the City Code of Ordinances provides whenever, there is cause to suspend or revoke an Occupation Tax Certificate, a written notice of the intent to suspend or revoke said Occupation Tax Certificate shall be sent and a hearing will be scheduled wherein the certificate holder may present his case before the city council or its designee; and,

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Sandy Springs, Georgia while in regular session on September 1, 2020, at 6:00 p.m. as follows:

1. G. Melton Mobley is named the City Council’s designee (the “City’s Designee”) for the purpose of conducting a hearing as to the suspension or revocation of occupation tax certificates and home occupations; and
2. The City’s Designee, on or before thirty (30) days after the issuance of the written notice of the intent to suspend or revoke an Occupation Tax Certificate, shall conduct a hearing to determine if the such grounds exist for the suspension or revocation of an Occupation Tax Certificate; and
3. The City’s Designee shall report findings and a decision in writing to the City’s tax collector within ten (10) days after the conclusion of the hearing; and

4. The decision made by the City's Designee shall be final unless the certificate holder applies to the Superior Court of Fulton County by filing a petition for writ of certiorari within thirty (30) days of the decision rendered by the City's designee.


