ITEM: Approval for the Mayor to sign the submission of Peachtree Dunwoody Road for submittal to GDOT for funding under the Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Council approve a section of Peachtree Dunwoody Road for consideration by the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) for the City's fiscal year 2015 Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant (LMIG) submission.

Background:

On an annual basis, GDOT allows submissions by local governments for funding of needed projects within city, county or state rights-of-way. The Public Works Department has selected a section of Peachtree Dunwoody Road to submit to GDOT for funding under this Grant which is due to GDOT by January 1, 2015.

Discussion:

Peachtree Dunwoody Road represents approximately 3.0 miles of roadway that is in need of resurfacing. Peachtree Dunwoody's average PCI is 58 based on 2012 Road Rating.

The City of Sandy Springs is to receive \$625,916.46, according to the GDOT formula amounts table. In order to receive this funding, the City must submit projects with estimated construction costs that equal this amount, plus 30%. For Sandy Springs, this means submitting at least \$813,692.39 estimated worth of work. The estimated amount to complete this work is \$814,255. It is recommended that the City submit work in excess of the necessary amount to insure expenditure of the entire grant plus the required 30%.

Staff estimates the amount to perform the work associated with Peachtree Dunwoody Road is \$814,255. Staff recommends that the City bid this work in conjunction with the FY 2016 capital resurfacing program in order to ensure expenditure of the grant and the required 30% match. Failure to expend the grant and match may result in the forfeiture of the grant.

Alternatives:

The City may choose to apply these grant funds toward another approved use such as intersection improvements, replacing storm drain pipes or culverts, bridge repair or replacement, and/or signal installation.

Financial Impact:

If the City chooses to submit Peachtree Dunwoody Road, the financial impact to the City will be the 30% required match of \$187,775.93, plus any funds that may be above and beyond that amount to complete the submitted list.


2015 LMIG

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AND APPROVE THE PROPOSED SUBMISSION OF A SECTION OF PEACHTREE DUNWOODY ROAD TO BE RESURFACED WITH THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FISCAL YEAR 2015 LOCAL MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT GRANT
