

PUBLIC SAFETY

SSPD

North District

Crime

- SSPD worked 16 *entering autos*, five burglaries, and one stolen auto this week. The majority of activity was in and around apartment complexes in the 8500 block of Roswell Rd. Two arrests were made in connection with an attempted robbery of a person, and one arrest was made in connection with burglary case.

South District

Crime:

- Officers located a stolen car that was abandoned on 285 eastbound near Peachtree Dunwoody Road. The car was stolen during an August armed robbery in DeKalb County. The car was impounded.
- Odd Job Tree Specialists reported an overnight burglary of a supply trailer. The trailer was located on Roswell Road. Two Stihl gas blowers and 20 chainsaws were taken.
- A resident reported a burglary of her home on Legrand Bend. The resident found an open door leading from the garage to the home. She reported eight designer purses, a MacBook Pro, and clothes were stolen. The woman suspects her ex-boyfriend, whom she broke up with just prior to the burglary.
- The number of thefts from cars increased slightly over the past week. Primary locations include Roswell Road and Peachtree Dunwoody Road. **The public is reminded to remove all valuables from the vehicle – or place out of sight – and lock the vehicle to help reduce the occurrences of this type of crime.**

Street Crimes Unit (SCU)

- The unit reported on misdemeanor arrest and five city ordinance arrests. The unit conducted 29 traffic stops, issued 24 citations, and four field contacts, and conducted 11 suspicious person/vehicle stops. The unit worked six drug complaints; six knock and talk investigations, and four hours of surveillance.
- An officer patrolling the Abernathy Road LA Fitness parking lot observed a suspicious vehicle. A traffic stop was conducted, and the driver found in possession of marijuana and a large amount of cash. The driver was arrested.
- Two individuals were arrested and charged with possession of illegal narcotics and paraphernalia following traffic stop by an officer patrolling the parking lots around Sandy Springs Circle.

Traffic Unit

- The unit made six misdemeanor arrests, one DUI arrest, and conducted 67 traffic stops, issuing 94 citations. The unit located one wanted person, and seized 57 grams of Marijuana seized. The unit spent 27 hours working traffic complaints.
- TRV 1 AND 2 conducted one impound, worked 19 crash calls, and conducted 23 patrol assists. The unit changed 11 flat tires, dispensed 11 gallons of gasoline, dispatched 114 self-initiated calls, and recovered one stolen vehicle. The unit conducted three vehicle jump-offs covering 740 patrol miles for the week.
- Officers are monitoring bus stop locations during the week now that school is back in session.

K-9 and Special Investigations Unit (SIU)

- The unit made seven felony arrests, one misdemeanor arrest, and one city ordinance arrest. The unit conducted 32 traffic stops, issued 26 citations, and conducted two suspicious person/vehicle stops. One wanted person was located. The K-9 conducted 12 searches (things), and the unit worked 17 drug complaints and 17 knock and talk investigations. The unit seized 83 grams of Marijuana, 39 grams of Methamphetamine, and 10 bottles of pills.
- A K-9 officer assisted the Drug Enforcement Agency with a K-9 sniff of a suspicious package. A positive K-9 alert led to the seizure of \$150,000 in U.S. currency.
- K-9 officers assisted the Special Investigations Unit with a narcotics investigation on Greyfield Lane. A positive K-9 alert of both a vehicle and an apartment led to the arrest of two individuals, one of whom was a drug dealer. A sawed-off shotgun and various illegal drugs were seized.
- A K-9 officer assisted the Uniform Patrol Division on a traffic stop where an open-air K-9 sniff was conducted. The K-9 alerted and marijuana was located.
- A K-9 officer observed a speeding reckless driver on Abernathy Road. The driver crashed his vehicle into a pedestrian sign and was charged with reckless driving. The driver was also operating the vehicle with a permit only without a licensed driver.

Criminal Investigations Division

- Shoplifting- 6000 block of Roswell Rd.: Three male suspects entered the store and worked as a team, distracting the sole employee in order for the group to steal. Seven iPhone cases were taken from the store. One of the suspects was a male, dressed as a female. The group also is suspected of committing another shoplifting. Two of the three suspects were identified with arrest warrants issued.
- Larceny - Allen Rd.: The victim claims an ongoing issue lasting for the last two years, suspecting the apartment maintenance personnel. In this case, books and a coffee maker were stolen. The victim had video surveillance, but the camera's memory cards were full and did not capture the incident.
- Bank Robbery - Roswell Road PNC Bank: Two suspects were arrested, and the female suspect confessed to 10 robberies, including the one in Sandy Springs.

Community Affairs

- Officers participated in Coffee with a Cop at SoHo Café & Bakery.
- Citizen Gun Safety Class was held with nine participants.

Volunteers

- The Citizens on Patrol Unit worked 143 hours and conducted 21 shifts this past week. They conducted 35 house checks and issued three handicap-parking citations, covering 738 total patrol miles.
- They handled 10 Private Property accidents and distributed SR13 forms.

SSFR

Operations:

- Responded to a total of 272 calls: Four fires, 97 EMS calls, 30 Service Calls, 104 Good Intent Calls, **26 False Alarms**
- Units were dispatched to reports of a reported structure fire at an apartment complex located in the 5600 block of Roswell Road. Upon arrival crew made contact with SSPD who informed SSFR that a fire had been set and extinguished following a domestic dispute between two males. Fire

crews found a small amount of smoke and dry chemical extinguishing powder in the home. The carpet area in front of the rear sliding glass door appeared to be burned, and a pour burn pattern was present. Positive pressure ventilation was performed to clear out the remaining smoke and dry chemical.

- Units were dispatched to I-285 Eastbound by Peachtree Dunwoody Road on reports of a possible vehicle fire. On arrival, crews found a single passenger vehicle with heavy fire involvement to the engine compartment. Crews extinguished the fire and overhauled the engine and passenger compartments. The owner stated that he was driving, and the passenger compartment began filling up with smoke from the vents.
- Units responded to a vehicle fire by the intersection of Roswell Road and Dunwoody Place. The crew found a small fire in the engine compartment. The fire was extinguished, and the crew found an oil rag, which had been left, packed under the oil filter housing. The vehicle had just had an oil change completed.
- Units were dispatched to the 100 block of Northwood Drive on reports of a possible structure fire. Crewmembers found a two story multi-family dwelling with light white smoke coming from the front door of one unit. Personnel found that the stove had caught fire and the fire was extinguished. Crewmembers removed the stove and used the positive pressure ventilation fan to remove the smoke. Once smoke was cleared, personnel took maintenance staff into the apartment and showed them what had happened.

Inspections:

- There were 72 inspections conducted with 38 violations cited.

Fire Training:

- ISO Company Level Training. Topics included: Ground ladder techniques, SCBA drills, rope rescue techniques, portable fire extinguishers, Downed Firefighter Drags and Carries, Vehicle Stabilization, Hose Deployment
- Nine firefighters attended prep class by SSFR training staff for challenging the NPQ Firefighter II testing.
- Training Staff began preliminary runs for the Firefighter Combat Challenge fitness course in development by SSFR.

Safety Education & Public Relations Events:

- SSFR oversaw four Public Education events with 94 participants: one birthday party, one community CPR, one station tour and Fire Warden training with Fire Corps.
- Two car seat inspections were conducted with three adults trained.
- The Medical Officer attended a 24-hour Incident Management for Active Shooter event hosted by Alpharetta Public Safety.

Volunteers

- Fire Corp logged 190.5 hours last month with activities including onsite participation for city special events, fire rehab activities for fire call-outs and training.

TRANSPORTATION

PROJECTS WITH MAJOR TRAFFIC IMPACTS

- Beginning on Monday, August 21, GDOT will detour GA400 southbound to I-285 West traffic nightly between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. through August 23. GA400 southbound to I-285 east traffic will be detoured on August 24 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

- Two eastbound lanes of Johnson Ferry, between Sandy Springs Circle and Roswell Road, remain closed between 6 a.m. – 4 p.m. for stormline work. A lane in each direction is available for motorists.

Proposals are currently under review.

The project is in the design phase. Survey crews will be surveying the intersection and approach roadways over the next few weeks.

CIP

- **CC-10 Sandy Springs Circle Streetscape, Phase II:** Final design development, utility coordination and relocation planning and right-of-way acquisition efforts are underway. Utility relocations are projected for winter 2017 with construction estimated for summer 2018.
- **T-34 Morgan Falls Road:** The construction project will be rebid for the final phase of the project and will begin later this year. The project will install storm water quality features and signage at Overlook Park. Landscape installation along Morgan Falls Road will be completed as part of the project.
- **T-43 Glenridge Drive at Roswell Road Intersection:** Project environmental coordination, utility coordination and design work continue. Right-of-way acquisition efforts are ongoing.
- **T-46 Carpenter Drive/Cliftwood Drive at Roswell Road Intersection Improvement:** Final punch list work is underway.
- **T-58 Connector Street from Boylston to Roswell Road:** Underground utility installation and site work are in progress.
- **T-62 City Springs Streetscapes and Trails:** Design work is underway. **Sandy Springs Circle from Mt. Vernon Highway to Johnson Ferry Road (west side):** provides a multi-use side path, lighting and landscaping from Mt. Vernon Highway to the Fire Station. **Johnson Ferry Road from Sandy Springs Circle to Roswell Road (north side):** provides a multi-use side path, landscaping and lighting on Johnson Ferry across the street from the new Performing Arts Center and City Springs. **Mt. Vernon Highway and Hilderbrand adjacent to City Springs site:** provides a connecting multi-use trail between Mt. Vernon Highway and Hilderbrand immediately adjacent to the Georgia Power Company substation. Construction is planned for 2018.
- **Mabry Road Drainage Project:** The City is ready to bid the project with pre-qualified construction contractors.

Sidewalk Program

- **Glenridge Drive at Northland Drive:** Construction plans are in permitting review.
- **Dudley Lane Sidewalk:** Design is underway for two phases of Dudley Lane sidewalk installation. Design work on the Atlanta portion is planned for completion later this month. Staff is coordinating right-of-way acquisition and utility relocations. Homeowners are encouraged to

contact the Public Works Right of Way staff with any questions regarding the right of way/easement documents mailed to them.

Transportation

- **T-0054 ATMS 3 Project**

The construction contract was approved for award to R.J. Haynie & Associates, Inc. by the City Council on August 15, 2017, pending approval by the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT).

- **T-7161 Mount Vernon Highway at Long Island Drive**

This project will add a northbound left turn pocket on Long Island Dr. at Mount Vernon Hwy and also a crosswalk across Long Island Dr. Notice to proceed has been issued to the contractor and a ground break ceremony took place on August 14, 2017.

- **FY 2017 Resurfacing FY 2017 GDOT LMIG**

All Milling and paving has been completed. Traffic Services are in the process of testing Traffic Loops on Sandy Springs Circle and Coldstream Court.

- **FY16 Bridge Maintenance**

A bid package is underway for repair of Windsor Parkway Bridge over Nancy Creek.

- **Mowing**

- I-285 & 400 mowing: Pro Cutter mowing crews working on GA400 NB this week.
- ProCutters primary and secondary mowing: Mowing began this week.

Litter Pickup: A street maintenance crew is handling litter pick up services. Continuing review of litter pickup on I-285 & GA400. Field inspections are performed on a daily basis by Field Services staff.

- **Utility Permitting and Coordination - permits received from July 31 to August 4, 2017:**

- 21 permits were received and 24 permits were issued.
- Two Pre-Construction meetings were held.
- Three permits placed on hold. (0 ATT, 0 Comcast, 0 AGL).
- Five active utility permits (Over 500 L.F) are undergoing construction; 42 permits in the process of being closed upon completion of restoration (1 AGL, 2 Comcast, 2 AT&T).
- 55 (Pending) utility permits closed out.
- Three water leaks were reported to the city and then reported to City of Atlanta Department of Watershed Mgmt.
- Four resident concerns were addressed in the field by staff pertaining to restorations, water line damages, gas line damages, and general questions about the utility work.
- There were 12 Service Ticket requests initiated and seven Service Ticket requests resolved.
- 17 Active COA water leaks were reported.
- 18 Open COA restorations were documented.

- **Street Lighting**

- One streetlight outage was received.
- One streetlight outages reported to Georgia Power.

After Hours Calls / Emergencies

- **Field Services:**

- On Call Superintendent responded to seven After Hours Calls for trees down: Riverside and Edgewater; Sherrell and Kayron; Dudley Lane and Carol Lane; On Call Superintendent also

responded to a water main break at Spalding which was canceled as City of Atlanta was on the scene. There was a gas leak at Sandy Springs Circle, and flooding and bridge inspection needed at the Nancy Creek Bridge.

- Fifteen new drainage work requests received last week.
- **465 Hammond Drive** – The project includes construction of drainage structures, storm pipe and lining an existing storm pipe. **A lane is scheduled to be closed on Hammond Drive the end of August.**
- **4930 Old House Trail** – Construction continues.
- **7185 Hunters Branch Drive** – A catch basin is being re-built. Layne Inliner had the lowest price.
- **Northland/Windsor Parkway** – The project consists of replacing storm pipe and structures in the right-of-way at the Northland/Windsor Parkway intersection. Layne Inliner had the lowest price bid.
