ITEM: Consideration of Approval of the GDOT FY 2011 Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant Paving Contract

Public Works Department's Recommendation:

Public Works staff recommends that the Mayor and City Council approve the GDOT FY 2011 Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant (LMIG) Paving Contract. Staff from the Public Works Department submitted a list of streets in January of 2011 for the GDOT funded grant. The list of streets was comprised of streets from the 2009 IMS Survey listed to be the next priorities for resurfacing in continuation with the City of Sandy Springs Pavement Management Program (Operation Pave On).

Background:

As Part of the City's capital improvement paving program Public Works Staff submitted a list of four roads to the Georgia Department of Transportation for consideration of funding under their LMIG program. All four roads were accepted and an agreement was entered into under LMIG for Sandy Springs to receive funds in the amount of \$290,063.41. This money is for the resurfacing of the four streets previously accepted: Carpenter Drive, Whitner Road, Hightower Trail and Northridge Parkway.

Discussion:

The City held the Pre-Bid Conference for the LMIG resurfacing contract on February 21, 2012. Seven bids were received on February 29, 2012. The bids received are shown below in order of lowest bid:

- Allied Paving \$ 375,081.15
- Baldwin Paving \$ 394,282.77
- Blount Const. \$ 395,200.25
- CW Matthews \$ 404,313.25
- Stewart Bros. \$ 467,080.04
- ER Snell \$ 494,421.40
- Lori's Trans. & Exca. \$ 518,252.15

The bids were evaluated by Charlie Roberts (Field Services Director) and Ruby Patton (Purchasing Manager). The evaluation focused specifically on the companies' GDOT prequalification, paving experience, past performance, quality of past work, and bid price.

Based on this review and analysis, staff recommends that the City award the LMIG Paving Contract to Allied Paving Inc. in the amount of \$375,081.15.

The following identifies each street that will be repaved as part of the GDOT Grant:

Alternatives:

Should the Mayor and City Council not approve the contract the City will forfeit the Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant funds allocated to the City and will be responsible for the entire cost of resurfacing of these four roads.

Financial Impact:

The GDOT Funding will reimburse up to \$290,063.41 of the cost of resurfacing. The City will be responsible for the remaining \$85,017.74 to cover additional work not covered by the grant such as patching, signal loops and striping. This work will be supervised by both the Sandy Springs Public Works Department and the local GDOT Area Office. Asphalt material testing will be handled by the Georgia Department of Transportation at no cost to the City.

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AND APPROVE THE FY 2011 LOCAL MAINTENANCE & IMPROVEMENT GRANT (LMIG) PAVING AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS FOR THE CITY OF SANDY SPRINGS, FULTON COUNTY, GEORGIA

WHEREAS, it is necessary, from time to time, to establish policies, procedures and guidelines consistent with the administration of a municipal government consistent with the US Constitution, Federal Statutes, alignment with Federal, Georgia's State Constitution, and the Charter for the City of Sandy Springs and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works, in response to the guidance provided by the City Manager, has applied for and received a grant from the Georgia Department of Transportation based on a list of roads submitted that were approved by the Mayor and City Council; and

WHEREAS, upon adoption of this Resolution, staff will incorporate the maintenance of the resurfaced roads into the City's pavement management program to effectuate the management of Department of Public Works policy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANDY SPRINGS, GEORGIA

Have reviewed and approved the award of the FY 2011 Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant (LMIG) Paving Contract between Allied Paving Contractor Inc. and The City of Sandy Springs and have authorized the city manager to execute a contract for this work.

The financial impact to the City of Sandy Springs for the approval of this contract is \$375,081.15, less the LMIG grant amount of \$290,063.41 for a total of \$85,017.74.
