ITEM: Consideration of Approval of Street Lights for the PCID Peachtree Dunwoody Project and the Fulton Phase 1 Project

Public Works Department's Recommendation:

The staff recommends that the Mayor and City Council accept the energy costs once construction is completed for the PCID Peachtree Dunwoody Streetscape and Intersection Improvement projects as well as the Fulton Phase 1 Streetscape and Intersection Improvement Projects.

Background:

The PCID has two projects moving forward that will entail installing pedestrian scale lighting, roadway lighting and intersection lighting. All lighting and fixtures will be to Georgia Power standards (Dark Sky's Friendly) and Georgia Power will maintain these fixtures and bulbs. The cost breakdown follows:

Peachtree Dunwoody

57 Pedestrian Lights - \$803.70
54 Street Lights - \$1,506.06
24 Intersection Lights - \$669.36
Total Monthly Payment - \$2,979.12

Fulton Phase 1

42 Pedestrian Lights - \$592.20
30 Street Lights - \$836.70
22 Intersection Lights - \$613.58
Total Monthly Payment - \$2,042.48

Discussion:

The new street lighting will be installed by a Georgia Power certified contractor so that Georgia Power will except the lighting and maintain the lighting. Staff is recommending Mayor and Council to approve the acceptance of the roadway and pedestrian lighting upon each project completion.

Alternatives:

The City can choose not to accept the power bill and no pedestrian lights or street lights will be provided.

Financial Impact:

The financial impact on the City would be an addition of \$5,021.60 to the monthly Georgia Power bill
